Dr. Velma Lois Jones moved the adoption of the rules and seconded by G. Bernice Richardson, 7th Episcopal District, New York-Washington District. The motion carried.

Certification: Roll Call and Seating of the Delegates by Ms. Pamela Springfield, Chair of Credentials.

Currently, there are 312 Delegates. (The count will be finalized later).

Mrs. Fredrena Brown (Central Georgia Region) inquired if the delegates from the Eleventh Episcopal District would be seated.

President Pegues responded by stating that the delegates and alternates were received by her and the Credentials Chair.

Mr. James Blackmon (Southeast Alabama Region) inquired about the cut-off date for submitting the delegates and alternates.

Dr. Princess Pegues indicated that the cut-off date is 30 days after the end of the annual conference. Dr. Pegues received the list of delegates and alternates from the Presiding Bishop Kenneth W. Carter of the Eleventh Episcopal District on June 17, 2019.

Presiding Bishop Teresa Jefferson-Snorton of the Fifth Episcopal District indicated that there are 11 different countries for the Eleventh Episcopal District. Bishop Jefferson-Snorton requested for the 19th Quadrennial Assembly to consider registration deadlines dates and extenuating circumstances and actions and seat the delegates.

Ms. Tiffanie Thompson (Birmingham Region) moved that the rules of the Assembly be amended to seat the delegation of the Tenth Episcopal District.

Senior Bishop Lawrence Reddick of the Eighth Episcopal District indicated that two delegates from Jamaica were elected and should be seated. Dr. Theresa Duhart indicated that she had registered the two delegates in May 2019.

Patron Bishop James B. Walker indicated that he attended a meeting of the Credentials Committee when an issue was raised regarding the delegation from the 11th Episcopal District.

President Pegues indicated that Patron Bishop Walker and the Credentials Committee would meet to address this issue.

Patron Bishop Walker would like to meet 30 minutes with Credential Committee, By-Laws and Constitution and Parliamentarian first, and then have a dialogue with Senior Bishop Reddick, Bishop Kenneth W. Carter, and Bishop Teresa Jefferson-Snorton about the seating of the delegation of the Eleventh Episcopal District.

Crystal Lewis (East Texas Region) indicated that additional chairs is needed for some of the delegates.

Clyde Coppin (Georgia North Region) indicated that the signs were blocking the view of many delegates and alternates.

Bishop Jefferson-Snorton asked the question if we are going to be the church of today being about the business of Jesus Christ.

Patron Bishop James B. Walker stated that the Committees were tasked with duties and have rendered a faithful decision.

It was moved by Nyla Barker (Florida Region) and seconded by Terrance Adkins (North Central Alabama Region) that the rules be suspended and the delegation of the 11th Episcopal District be seated.

Parliamentarian Dr. Velma Lois Jones stated that the Constitution and By-Laws may only be changed at the General Conference which cannot be done here and would be out of order.
