Executive Board Governing Rules

- 1. Rules of the Executive Board shall be governed by the most recently revised Constitution and Bylaws and Discipline of the Christian Methodist Episcopal Church as well as Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised (11th Edition).
- 2. The greeting /salutation is stated ONLY once, by the first speaker of the event. All others who follow need only to acknowledge the President/Presiding Officer, and the Patron Bishop (if present).

To "Madam President" or "President Scott", or "Patron Bishop Walker". The greeting is INAPPROPRIATE to say before giving a report, and by all means, before offering a Meditation. These guidelines are applicable for plenary sessions, luncheons and events.

- 3. It is INAPPROPRIATE to say, "PROTOCOL HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED".
- 4. All meetings of this body shall start and end on time. Cell phones, pagers and other communication devices shall be turned to the "off" or "silent" positions so as not to disturb the flow of the assembly and as a common courtesy to all present.
- 5. Following the Roll Call, the first item of business shall be the Adoption of Governing Rules, and the Agenda, with modifications as deemed necessary by the President (Presiding Officer).
- 6. All members of the Executive Board, Observers, and/or Registered Guests are required to openly display badges to enter all meetings and functions and shall sit in designated seating areas. Only members of the Executive Board shall make motions and vote.
- 7. All attendees should refrain from walking during dais introductions, the meditation or while the President or Patron Bishop is giving her/his address to the assembly.
- 8. All attendees shall stand when the President, the Patron Bishop, former Council Presidents or Bishops enter the room for the FIRST TIME, or when they are introduced.
- 9. Any materials being distributed should be passed to the HEAD TABLE FIRST.
- 10. Each member of the Executive Board who wishes to speak shall proceed to the microphone, wait to be recognized by the presiding officer, address the officer as Madam President; speak clearly and distinctly. After being recognized, give your name, Annual Conference, city & state. Limit your statement or concern to a maximum of two (2) minutes. Debate is limited to three (3) minutes. The time limit and number of times a member addresses a question or concern will be enforced by the timekeeper subject to any extension directed by the presiding officer.
- 11. Persons wishing to speak who are not members of the Board may do so with the permission of the presiding officer.
- 12. Persons giving reports should always have at least three (3) copies of report, for president, patron bishop, secretary. One copy for the presenter totals four.

A HISTORICAL SKETCH OF THE WOMEN'S MISSIONARY COUNCIL

The Women's Connectional Council of the Christian Methodist Episcopal church was organized September 7, 1918 at Capers Chapel CME Church in Nashville, Tennessee. Dr. Mattie E. Coleman from Tennessee was elected the first president and Mrs. Helena B. Cobb from Georgia was elected vice president.* Other officers elected were: Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. M. L. Copeland from Kentucky; and Recording Secretary, Mrs. T. H. McKenzie from Alabama. Other officers appointed by the President and affirmed by the Council were: Assistant Recording Secretary, Mrs. S. L. Helm from Illinois; and Treasurer – Mrs. Cora L. Nelson from Mississippi. In 1986, the name was changed to the Women's Missionary Council of the Christian Methodist Episcopal Church.

The Mission of the Women's Missionary Council of the Christian Methodist Episcopal Church is to share the good news, salvation through Jesus Christ with unsaved men, women, and children at home and abroad by using the processes and programs outlined in the Bible, the *Book of Discipline* of the Christian Methodist Episcopal Church, and the Constitution and By-Laws of the Women's Missionary Council.

The Women's Missionary Council operates at four (4) levels namely: The Council, the Annual Conference (Region), the District Conference, and the Local Church under a Constitution ratified by the General Conference and By-Law certified by the Quadrennial Assembly. Information flows downward and each level is organized the same as the Council Level. The Council serves in thirty-two Regions (Annual Conferences) in the United States, seven Regions (Annual Conferences) in Ghana and Nigeria, Africa, and several Regions in Haiti and Jamaica. Since the 2010 General Conference established an 11th Episcopal District in Africa comprising 10 countries; we have extended our Overseas Missions to include these countries.

The Council meets annually for Executive Board (except the year in which the Quadrennial Assembly is held) to hear reports from the Council's Officers, the departmental secretaries, and chairmen of committees and commissions. The first Executive Board was held in 1940. *The Quadrennial Assembly* is held the last week in June, during which time the Council Officers, Departmental Secretaries, and Chairpersons are elected for a four year term, with the possibility of serving a maximum of two terms or eight years.

Since 1940, a publication entitled the *Missionary Messenger* has served as the official organ for the Council. The Council grows and develops through Institutes, Leadership Schools, and Council Training Programs. The Council is presently emphasizing: Education, Health Initiative, the relief of Hunger at Home and Abroad, Mentoring, and the Black Family.

The programs of the WMC are done through three Major divisions with each division having a leader, and departments. Each department has a leader who is called the "Secretary" of the department. Much of the work is done through these departments. The Divisions are: Structure, Program, Service and Outreach. The Logo is the wheel. Each officer, departmental chairperson, and secretary of a committee or commission is listed on a spoke.

The Council is affiliated with our sister denominations, the African Methodist Episcopal Church (AME), the Methodist Episcopal Zion Church (AMEZ). Being ecumenical minded, the Council is affiliated with many national and international religious and social organizations including: Church Women United, American Bible Society, Bread for the World, National Council of Churches, World Federation of Methodist and Uniting Church Women, Balm in Gilead, the National Council of Negro Women, and the NAACP.

Eleven Presidents have led the Council in an outstanding manner, namely: Dr. Mattie E. Coleman (1918-1939), Mrs. Rossie T. Hollis (1939-1955), Mrs. E.W.F. Harris (1955-1963), Mrs. Phyllis H. Bedford (1963-1971), Mrs. Pauline B. Grant (1971-1979), Dr. Thelma J. Dudley (1979-1987), Dr. Sylvia M. Faulk (1987-1995), Dr. Judith E. Grant (1995-2003), Dr. Elnora P. Hamb (2003 -2011), Dr. Princess Rogers Pegues, (2011–2019) and Mrs. Jacqueline I. Scott. (2019—Presently). A Bishop is assigned by the College of Bishop to assist and give spiritual guidance to the Missionary Council. He is known as the Patron Bishop. Presently serving is Bishop James B. Walker.



Missionary Day Report-WMS Kenya Region

First, we thank the Almighty God for enabling us to plan and have a successful women missionary day despite all the challenges brought by covid19. Secondly, we acknowledge and appreciate the continued support of our Bishop Kenneth Carter PresidingPrelate11th District, Hilda Buie International Secretary Overseas Missions ,and Rev. John Ogola Omondi Mission Supervisor Kenya Region.

The WMS executive leaders Kenya region first met in July and on the onset agreed to have a missionary day on 26th September 2020. They identified Shimone Children's home in Utawala, Nairobi as the home to visit. Strategic planning meetings continued through the months via zoom in observance of social distancing. Below is a detailed account of the women missionary day Nairobi Kenya Region.

All the members invited converged at a central point in Utawala and a brief introduction was done by our President Martha Maruru. The team then proceeded to Shimone Children's home where we all arrived at 11am.

Welcome speech by the Children's Home Director

On arrival the team was welcomed by the Director Bishop Hosea. He opened the session with a word of prayer. He expressed his gratitude of the teams sacrifice of their time just to spend time with the children. He introduced the board members who run the children's home and also the caregivers. He then welcomed the Executive Treasurer Martha to give a brief intro and background about Shimone Children's home.

Shimone Children's Home Brief History

At Shimone Children's Home was founded in July 2018 by a young woman _ Elizabeth Wanjiru who had a passion to help the needy and less fortunate in the society. Our project covers orphaned, very poor and vulnerable children (OPV) in the society. The Children come from different parts of the country and from poor and vulnerable back grounds. Some of the children are from slums dwelling areas in Korogocho in Nairobi, Naivasha etc. Shimone children's home is located at Airways, Utawala area and comprises of 25 children with age ranging from 5years to 15years (13 girls and 12 girls). The home is currently at a rented house premise. The children are currently schooling at the neighboring primary schools within our locality with a few in high school. Elizabeth got an opportunity abroad and left the country soon after founding the children's home. She left the home under the running and care of the executive board members under the leadership of the Director Bishop Hosea Gitonga. After further discussions the executive board formed a board of members to help with the running of the home and supporting the children on various needs including food, their education, utilities bills and daily operations of the home.

Mission and Policy Statement

To provide a stable foundation that is rooted in education and health care for orphaned, poor, vulnerable, deprived and destitute children who have lost their own family. We will provide a loving and safe, family environment that enables children the right to a happy, educated, skilled and healthy life.

Aims and Objectives

- Provide love, food, shelter, clothing, education, safe drinking water, medical care and career opportunities to orphaned, deprived and destitute children.
- Help cut down the number of orphaned, poor and vulnerable children in the Kenyan society.
- Improve access to education for underprivileged children, by creating a sponsorship program.
- To assist the less fortunate pupils and students in meeting school expenses.
- Help children who are not academically inclined to acquire technical skills, which will allow them to support themselves in the future.
- To train individual members on how to start community programs including volunteer services/ programs.

Long term goals

- Obtain 10 acres of land and build a rehabilitation centre with a school which will not only support the children at Shimone Children's home alone but the community within its locality.
- Build a home that will raise, nurture and re-habilitate children, aged 4 and above.
- Establish a non-government organization Shimone Foundation that will provide a volunteer program, child sponsorship program, support the vulnerable women and support the elderly in the society.
- Build a tertiary college for the children to train those students who do not qualify for university or colleges to train on technical skills and enhance their livelihood.

Presentation by WMS President

Afterwards our WMS president Kenya region Martha Maruru introduced the WMS executive team presented a brief about the mission and objectives of the WMS.

The new office bearers were elected in March 2020 during Kenya Region Annual Conference with Bishop Kenneth Carter Presiding Prelate of the 11th Episcopal District. The President Martha Maruru, Vice President Jacqueline Wambui Odhiambo, Secretary -Elizabeth Omondi, Treasurer –Lydia Miano Makori, Ass Treasurer – Margaret Kageni.

Main Objectives

- 1. To implement the mission and unity of the Christian church in Christ Jesus.
- 2. To encourage the study of the bible and to assist in spreading the Gospel.
- 3. To study the needs of the society in order to aid development of programs, people, processes and resources that will enable the WMS to fulfill its mission.
- 4. Women empowerment spiritually and economically.

Projects

- Loans and savings Projects (table banking) starting from Nairobi District 1 until we reach all the districts.

The Department of Hunger/Meals for Millions continue to work with across the Regions to provide disaster relief to affected areas due to the pandemic and domestic disasters which have included flooding, hurricanes and other challenges. Individual reports will highlight the work being done in each department.

Approximately five thousand-fifty dollars (\$5,550,00) was donated to purchase approximately thirty-eight (38) sewing machines.
